A magisterial inquiry was entered into on Wednesday at the Albert Hotel, on the body of James Curran, a miner, aged about 45 years, a native of Longford, in Ireland, who was found dead in his bed about noon on Tuesday, December 25th.

It appeared from the post mortem examination made by Dr. O'Connor that the cause of death was disease of the lungs, hastened by intemperance.

Deceased was hurriedly interred the evening of the inquiry in the Whroo Cemetery, without the semblance of a funeral service, and followed by only some half dozen attendants.

The name of Mr Curran was not included on the brass plaque in the cemetery when installed in 2018.
